I have recently been told that the "Paddle on the Green" produces 4-5 kg of coffee grounds a day! The reason I'm telling you this is that you can use coffee grounds as a plant feed and they are keen to recycle. If you want to try some, just pop in and ask.

Having done a bit of research it appears that they are quite acidic and don't suit all plants but are good on hydrangeas, azaleas and rhododendrons. There is lots of information about their use on the internet. Best to use them in moderation, mixed with compost and spread thinly but they are free...... so worth a try. I'm going to put some around my hydrangeas and see what happens!

Our speaker this month is Tim Woodford who is talking about bulbs in containers for colour all year round. There will be an opportunity to buy bulbs but **he can only take cash** so come prepared! He may have something special.

Finally, although it's too early to mention the 'C' word, (banned in my house until December 1st!) we have decided to have the Christmas social in the afternoon this year in the hope that a few more will manage to come. I know December in Milford can get hectic and our meeting is always fairly near Xmas but we'll see how it goes.
